Mayor Danny Edwards called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM and called for a moment of silence.

Mayor Danny Edwards asked Administrator Burton to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Danny Edwards called for a motion to approve the minutes for October 18, 2022. Councilman Keith Pace made the motion, Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward second. Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay.

Mayor Danny Edwards opened for public comment and went over rules of meeting as it pertained to public comment.

Mr. Winchester, resident, and property owner in Walhalla, came forward to ask questions and seek clarity regarding abandoned properties ordinance. He shared his concerns. City Administrator Brandon Burton answered his questions and further explained the purpose for registering vacant and abandoned buildings in the city. Councilman Grant Keehn added that the Community Development Committee has suggested for the City Council to table this ordinance to allow more time to work on the language and better detail the rules and exceptions.

Mayor Danny Edwards moved the meeting forward to administrator comments.

City Administrator Brandon Burton informed council that the Main Street Director position is posted. Administrator Burton requested that a member of council join the interview panel, in addition to someone from the Main Street Organization and two individuals from outside the city.

Administrator Burton discussed the sanitation truck fire. The fire was investigated and determined the cause was nothing suspicious. The adjustor looked at the damage and the insurance appraisal allowed the city \$182,000. Administrator Burton is still working on this.

Administrator Burton reminded everyone that the Façade Grants are open. There is approximately \$20,000 in the account. He would like to get some more applications in and added that the application process is now online on the city website.

Stumphouse contractor is continuing to flag the trails. Administrator Burton plans to meet with the contractor around the 1st of December to hike the trail.

Administrator Burton announced the Greenway contract was advertised last week on SCBO and the city website. The bid closing will be December 8, 2022.

Planning Commission is requesting a joint meeting with City Council in January to review the Historical Ordinance.

Administrator Burton requested council to come up with a date in December to discuss the budget for fiscal year 2024.

Administrator Burton read Resolution 2022-8 from the Municipal Association of the Municipal Insurance Risk and Financing Fund, which is who we have our general liability and property insurance through. They have requested for all municipalities to adopt a resolution for deductible amounts. Councilman Pace made a motion to accept resolution 2022-8, Councilman Keehn second. Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay.

Administrator Burton read Resolution 2022-9 regarding an agreement for mutual aid with Clemson University Police Department to help with football games and other events. Councilman Keehn made a motion to approve resolution 2022-9, Councilman Pace second. Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay.

Administrator Burton reveiwed second reading for Ordinance 2022-8, ordinance for rules of decorum at public meetings. Administrator Burton read details of the ordinance. Mayor Edwards called for a motion to adopt Ordinance 2022-8. Councilman Pace made motion, Mayor Pro-Tm Woodward second. Mayor Danny Edwards called for public comment pertaining to Ordinance 2022-8. There were none. Mayor Edwards called for discussion. Councilman Grant Keehn proposed an amendment to use more precise language, so not to be confused with Ordinance 2022-9. Councilman Keehn explained the changes he wanted to make. He also proposed to change from a presiding officer to the full council when making the decision for what is allowed and not allowed. Councilman Keehn made this in form of a motion, Councilman Pace second. Mayor Edwards called for discussion. Councilman Pace second the proposed changes as suggested by Councilman Grant Keehn. Councilman Pace explained the mayor's role as presiding officer, as voted for by the community. Discussion continued. Mayor called for a vote in favor of amending Ordinance 2022-8. On voice vote, 3 yeas: Councilman Keehn,

Councilman Jordan, and Councilman Underwood. 3 nays: Councilman Pace, Mayor Danny Edwards, Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward. Motion for the amendment failed. Discussion continued amongst councilmembers regarding changes for Ordinance 2022-8. Mayor Pro-Tm Danny Woodward proposed amending the language in Article III, Line 4-5 from "shall be" charged to "could be" charged and made that in form of a motion, Councilman Jordan second. Mayor Edwards called for a discussion. Councilmembers discussed. Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Councilman Pace proposed amending the title of the ordinance to "City Council and Committee Meetings", in place of "Public Meetings" and made that in the form of a motion, Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward second. Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Councilman Underwood proposed amending "The majority of Americans believe that our society is increasingly unsuitable..." by striking it out of the ordinance and he made that in form of a motion, Councilman Keehn second. Mayor Edwards called for discussion. Councilman Pace suggested striking out another part of the ordinance, "city boards and commissions and other public bodies and various committees". Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Councilman Pace proposed adding back in the line that was stricken in the previous meeting for Article II, Paragraph 1, Line B to read, "members shall maintain a civil manner and tone" and strike "and courteous". Councilman Pace made that in the form of a motion, Councilman Underwood second. Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Councilman Underwood made a motion to strike Line F, Article II Councilman Keehn second. On voice vote, 3 yeas: Councilman Keehn, Councilman Jordan, and Councilman Underwood. 3 nays: Councilman Pace, Mayor Danny Edwards, Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward. Motion failed. Councilman Jordan proposed amending Article IV, Number 1, to "to call repeal of conflicting" and Article IV, Number 2, to "should a disagreement arise by the ruling from the chair current Robert's Rules of Order shall be used as prevailing", Councilman Pace second. Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Mayor Edwards called for vote on amended Ordinance 2022-8. On voice vote, 5 yeas: Mayor Danny Edwards, Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward, Councilman Pace, Councilman Jordan, and Councilman Underwood. 1 nay: Councilman Keehn. Motion carries.

Administrator Burton requested a motion to untable Ordinance 2022-9 for discussion. Councilman Underwood made the motion, Councilman Pace second. Mayor Edwards called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Administrator Burton explained specific details for Ordinance 2022-9, ordinance for rules of decorum at public meetings. Councilman Pace proposed amending the title by adding "City Boards and Commissions" in place of "public". He also proposed striking 2nd, 3rd, and 4th paragraphs of "whereas", same as council ordinance. Councilman Pace suggested amending page 2 to reflect the Board of Commissions. Councilman Pace made his proposed amendments in the form of a motion, Councilman Underwood second. Mayor called for discussion. No discussion occurred. Mayor called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Councilman Keehn proposed amending the language in this ordinance to language used in Ordinance 2022-8, "should a disagreement arise by the ruling from the chair current Robert's Rules of Order shall be used as prevailing", Councilman Underwood second. Mayor Edwards called for discussion. No discussion occurred. Mayor Edwards called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Mayor Edwards opened for public comment. No public comments occurred. Councilman Pace made a motion to accept Ordinance 2022-9 as amended, Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward second. Mayor Edwards called for discussion. No discussion occurred. Mayor Edwards called for vote. On voice vote, 5 yeas: Mayor Danny Edwards, Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward, Councilman Pace, Councilman Jordan, and Councilman Underwood. 1 nay: Councilman Keehn. Motion carries.

Mayor Edwards reintroduced reading of Ordinance 2022-13, ordinance that requires registration for vacant and abandoned building, commercial and residential. Councilman Pace asked to be recognized and made a motion to table this ordinance until the new Community Development Planner starts since this will reflect on her position, Councilman Underwood second. Mayor called for discussion. No discussion occurred. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Motion carries.

Mayor Edwards moved forward to discussion and action items.

Administrator Burton discussed awarding contract to Doug Peay Masonry, Inc for \$24,450. The city received a grant from Partners for Progress for \$16,000. The remaining will be funded out of the hospitality fund for \$8,450. This is to repair the concrete bleachers, sidewalks, and steps for the dugout access at the Chicopee Ballfield. Mayor Pro-Tempore made the motion to approve the contact, Councilman Pace second. Mayor Edwards called for discussion. Councilman Pace asked about the grant from Partners for Progress. Administrator Burton said the funds were from a fundraiser held by Partners for Progress. Mayor Edwards called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Motion carries.

Administrator Burton continued discussion with next item, Walhalla water line improvements. This is to replace water lines in the Poplar Springs area and on North Highway 11. The city issued an RFP funded by the county ARPA money where they gave us a little over \$2.4 million. After low interest in bidding for this project, Administrator Burton requested awarding bid to Harper General Contractors in the amount of \$2,474,080. Councilman Pace made the motion to move forward with the contract, Mayor Pro-Tempore Woodward second. Mayor Edwards called for discussion. No discussion occurred. Mayor Edwards called for vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay. Motion carries.

Councilmembers gave Committee Reports.

Mayor Edwards called for motion to go into Executive Session. Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward made the motion, Councilman Underwood second. Mayor Edwards called for a vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay.

Mayor called meeting back to regular session, following conclusion of executive session.

Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward made the motion to come out of Executive Session, Councilman Pace second. Mayor Edwards called meeting back to regular session. Councilman Pace made a motion on an ordinance to approve on an economic incentive with Hotel Alum and other matters related thereto, Mayor Pro-Tempore Woodward second. Mayor Edwards called for discussion and vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay.

Councilman Underwood made a motion to authorize the City Administrator to negotiate employment terms regarding the Municipal Judge, Councilman Keehn second. Mayor Edwards called for discussion and vote. All present councilmembers voted yea. None nay.

Mayor Edwards requested that item 2 in executive session be noted that no action was taken.

Councilman Keehn made a motion to amend ordinance by adding "City Council", in place of "public", Councilman Pace second. Councilmembers discussed. For the hotel project to continue and in efforts to resolve the existing parking challenges, Mr. and Mrs. Harris are proposing for the city of Walhalla to gift Priority Property Group the City Gym building and surrounding parking on the Eastern side, the the grassy area behind the Performing Arts Center, as this is already an estimated \$7 million project. Their idea is to construct a parking lot or a parking garage. This will add another \$500,000 to their budget but it will allow more space for parking for the PAC and Hotel Alum. They will also be able to move forward with the hotel project. Mr. and Mrs.

Harris are also asking for an additional 15 feet past the current property lines at the exterior of the school for purposes of outdoor dining to accommodate restaurant seating and lounge area. She continued discussing the pros of this project for the city, and other requests for assistance from the city, as well as suggestions regarding grants.

Mrs. Caroline Harris introduced Greg Metcalf, their restaurateur, to share his vision for the hotel restaurant. Mr. Metcalf is the operator and the CEO of AGM Restaurant Group out of Georgetown, SC. He spoke about his restaurant experience and expertise, as well as the restaurants he currently owns in various locations.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE WALHALLA CITY COUNCIL APRIL 19, 2022, 5:30 PM

Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward led the moment of silence.

Councilman Keith Pace led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Councilman Pace made the motion, Councilman Jordan second.

Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward asked for a motion to approve the City Council Minutes from March 15, 2022. Councilman Pace made the motion, Councilman Keehn second. Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called for vote. All voted in favor.

Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called for public comment and went over rules of meeting as it pertained to public comment.

Ken Sloan, President and CEO of Visit Oconee, was the first public comment regarding the greenway project. He detailed how far the city has come since 2008, when the Palmetto Trail, the Stumphouse Bike Park and the greenway project were first introduced. He discussed the growing tourism-based economy these new projects have brought to the area. Mr. Sloan reminded the council that investors invested in the city based on the promise of these plans and projects and asked that the council remember this when they vote on the greenway.

Luther Lyle, representative of the Museum of Cherokee in South Carolina, thanked the city for their support of the museum and shared plans for celebrating their 10 year anniversary with a 2nd Annual Kituwah, in cooperation with Main Street Walhalla. He added a personal note at the end of his comments by stating that he supports the greenway project.

John Powell, owner of Powell Real Estate Agency and realtor for 49 years, born and raised in Walhalla, and even served on the city council for two terms. He discussed the improvements to the city, specifically Main Street, he has over the last several years. He highlighted how businesses started coming to town because of these changes. Mr. Powell shared statistics and compared these numbers to previous statistics, prior to these improvements. He spoke about the projects that are responsible for economic growth and encouraged the council to continue to move forward with growing the city and not to go backwards. Mr. Powell also reminded the council of the investors who invested in the city based on the promises of these project, such as the greenway. He asked the councilmembers to keep their promise to these investors and continue to create a lifestyle environment for families.

David Lyle, resident of Walhalla, shared a map of early Walhalla from 1890 that showed how the Germans, who founded the town, intended for a greenway to be a part of the city's plan. Mr. Lyle further discussed his support for the greenway project.

Janet Smalley, resident of Walhalla, retired schoolteacher, and volunteer for Walhalla Partners in Progress, spoke about her support for the greenway.

Dan Pollock, county resident, spoke about his support for the greenway and the reasons he believes it will be good for the city. He encouraged the council to vote the project through.

Bruce Justice, business owner and property owner in Walhalla, spoke about his support for the greenway and vented his frustrations regarding the talk of the greenway project being cancelled.

David Lecroy, resident of the Keowee community, spoke out against the greenway project and gave his reasons for why the greenway is not necessary.

Lorelei Swanson, resident of Mountain Rest and volunteer for the city of Walhalla, spoke about her support for the greenway project and gave examples for why this would be good for the families in our community.

Jim Mann, resident of Walhalla, shared his concerns regarding the greenway and the financial impact it will have on everyone in the city, including those who don't have the ability to increase their earnings. He further detailed the reasons behind his concerns and asked the council to consider both sides when making their decision.

Lana Justice, property owner in Walhalla, reiterated the promise that was made to businesses and investors regarding the building of the greenway project and how now that promise is being reconsidered. She encouraged the council to do the right thing for the town and its future and move forward with the construction of the greenway.

Cliff Powell, resident and business professional in Walhalla, shared his support for the greenway project and discussed the reasons this project would benefit the city.

Kelvin Bryant, resident of Walhalla and Planning Commissioner, discussed his support for the greenway project.

Christina McDowell, resident of Walhalla, shared her opposition to the greenway project for now. She discussed other issues within the city that need to be addressed before funding the greenway project. Mrs. McDowell spoke about prioritizing the needs of the residents who live in the community and not making decisions based on the needs of people passing through. She shared her personal struggles with the affordability of living here and fears that this project will increase the financial difficulty for her and others in similar situations.

Lisa Holbrook, resident of Walhalla, is in support of the greenway and shared her opinion based on the town she lived in prior to moving to Walhalla. Her previous hometown had a greenway that greatly benefited the community and their families.

Lynn McClain, resident of Walhalla and business owner, discussed the businesses in town who do not maintain the appearance of their buildings and the need for enforcement to keep up the repairs and the appearances of these buildings. She spoke about the litter from food trucks left in front of her business, and if these food trucks are going to be permitted to do business there, they need to be responsible for cleaning up their trash.

Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward asked if there was anyone else for public comment. There was not, so public comment was closed. Mr. Woodward thanked everyone who attended and spoke at the meeting.

Councilman Grant Keehn interjected and asked if he could make a motion to move up the last item on the agenda to be discussed first for the people who were at the meeting regarding the greenway funding, rather than having them sit through the entire meeting. Councilmembers discussed. Councilman Keehn made a motion to amend the agenda to move up the discussion for the greenway funding, Councilman Jordan second. Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called for vote and discussion. Supermajority voted in favor.

Councilman Grant Keehn started the discussion by asking the audience members from the community who would be willing to contribute their own money to fund the greenway. He followed that question by asking who would contribute their neighbor's money, or the poorest people's money to fund the greenway. Audience members wanted an explanation of what Councilman Keehn meant, as he continued to discuss his stance on the issue. Councilwoman Sarai Melendez spoke up and asked for the meeting to be called back to order. She explained to Councilman Keehn that the discussion is between council since the public comment session was closed.

Councilman Keehn continued by making a motion to take the money from the greenway fund, that originally came from water customers, and return it to the water fund which it came from. Councilman Jordan second. Councilman Underwood asked how the water money was moved to the greenway fund. Administrator Burton gave the explanation. Mayor Edwards added to the explanation. Councilmembers continued the discussion and expressed their individual opinions. Councilman Pace made the motion to call to question and stop all debate. Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called for vote. The majority voted to end debate. The next call for

vote was in response to returning the money from the greenway project to where it came from originally. Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called for vote. Majority opposed and motion did not pass.

Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called meeting back in session. Next on the agenda is the resolution proclaiming April 29, 2022, as Arbor Day in the city of Walhalla. Administrator Brandon Burton read Resolution 2022-6, proclaiming April 29, 2022, as Arbor Day in the city of Walhalla. Councilman Pace made a motion for this resolution, Councilman Jordan second. Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called for vote and discussion. All voted in favor.

Councilman Keith Pace made a motion for the first reading on Ordinance 2022-2, which is an ordinance to amend Ordinance 1976-5, an ordinance to amend section 22-5 85, prohibiting possession and open containers and consumption of wine, beer, ale, porter, and other similar malts or fermented beverages in public areas of the city of Walhalla and other matters related thereto. Councilman David Underwood second. Mayor Pro-Tempore Danny Woodward called for vote and discussion. All voted in favor.

Mayor Edwards called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

Mayor Edwards led the moment of silence.

Councilman Jordan led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Edwards called for the approval of the council meeting minutes for 11/16/2021, 12/7/2021, and 12/21/2021. Councilman Pace made the motion and Councilman Woodward seconded. There were no changes or discussion. All present voted in favor.

Mayor Edwards called for public comment. Mayor Edwards went over rules of meeting as it pertained to public comment.

Jim Aguilera, from Walhalla and business owner of Trailhead Tavern, is requesting approval for the Trailhead Tavern sign to replace the old Backstreet Burgers sign. He further requests approval for a wooden sign reading Trailhead Tavern to be posted on the side of the building, facing the parking lot. Mr. Aguilera has submitted photos for approval. Elijah Hayes addressed the council and informed them that the sign is conformed to the ordinance, but it is a freestanding sign, and will require approval from the city council. Mr. Woodward made a motion to approve, Mr. Pace second. Mayor called for discussion and vote. All voted in favor.

Administrator Burton moved forward with administrator comments announcing Mr. Will Bates as the appointed new Fire Chief for Walhalla. Mr. Burton discussed the overage bill from the Sewer Authority and informed everyone that the bill was recalculated, and we do not owe anything above our normal monthly expense. He hopes to have RFP discussion and approval at the next council meeting. Mr. Burton thanked the staff for all the work they did during the snowstorm with power outages and road safety. He announced that the grant for Stumphouse was approved, and we should be able to complete phase 3 on the extra 10 miles for the mountain bike trail and probably fund the parking lot at Ross Mountain. Lastly, Mr. Burton discussed the committee make up and need for changes to be updated.

Mayor Edwards resumed meeting stating there were no proclamations or resolutions. There are a couple of ordinances for second and final readings.

Councilman Pace gave final reading on Ordinance 2021-33 to amend Zoning Ordinance 2021-17 to redesignate parcel 500-14-17-003, 500-14-17-004, 500-14-17-005, and 500-14-17-006. Mr. Pace made motion, Mr. Keehn second. Mr. Keehn requested discussion to help everyone understand the details of the ordinance. Mr. Burton explained details. Mayor called for discussion and vote. All voted in favor.

Councilman Pace gave final reading on Ordinance 2021-34 to amend Zoning Ordinance 2021-17 to incorporate a color palette into the design guidelines. Mr. Pace made motion, Mr. Woodward second. Mayor called for discussion and vote. All voted in favor.

Councilman Keehn gave first reading of Ordinance 2022-1 to issue amendment 4 to amend FY2022 budget and Appendix A and other related matters. Mr. Keehn further discussed why it is necessary for the sewer and water rates to be raised. Mr. Keehn made a motion, Councilman Jordan second. Administrator Burton explained the details and made recommendations for water rate increase. Mr. Scott Parris added to explanation. Following discussion, Councilman Pace made and amendment and a motion for a base rate adjustment for water rates, Councilman Jordan second. Mayor called for discussion and vote on the amendment and, separately, the amended motion. All voted in favor.

Administrator Burton discussed the sewer rates and gave detailed explanation regarding the rate increases. The Sewer Authority increased rate 20%. Mr. Burton explained the reason for additional 20% increase in addition to the SA increase, totaling 40% increase. Discussion continued amongst councilmembers. Mayor Edwards voiced that he is not in support of the 20% increase before the Sewer Authority does their 20% increase. Mayor Edwards wants to look at the numbers before it goes to a vote. Discussion continued amongst councilmembers and Scott Parris. Councilman Keehn made a motion to raise sewer rates to the 40%, Councilman Jordan second.

Previous motion withdrawn. A motion to reconsider the originally discussed plan for water and 40% increase for sewer was made by Councilman Keehn, Mayor Pro-Tempore Woodward second. Mayor called for discussion and vote. All voted in favor.

Administrator Burton shared advice from the city attorney, Mr. Kozlarek, stating that he would like for the council to formally vote and accept the FY 2021 audit. Councilman Pace made the motion that the audit be accepted as written, Councilman Jordan second. Mayor called for discussion and vote. All voted in favor.

Administrator Burton opened discussion regarding the open container ordinance. Discussion was had between councilmembers and Chief Sean Brinson. Everyone agreed this topic needs to be further discussed and is not ready for a formal vote, yet.

Administrator Burton announced Mrs. Rosemary Bailes resignation from the Planning Commission.
