Call to Order: Mayor Hall called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM, with a quorum present to conduct the meeting and welcomed all present to the meeting.

Grant Keehn Councilman Worked with four prospective/existing business.

Dirt Road Wares Ribbon Cutting was held November 14, 2025 Initial preparations for two ribbon cuttings in January/February.

Lynn McClain Councilwoman

Reviewed and approved 6 permits (zoning, sign).

Sarai Melendez Councilwoman Fielded questions from the public regarding setbacks, variances, new business process, zoning requirements, HTAX, ATAX, business licenses and building permit process.

HTAX compliance being addressed. Full compliance expected by end of year.

Michael Kozlarek City Attorney FY 25-26 Projects

Celia Boyd Myers City Administrator **Zoning Ordinance Update:** Jeff Guilbaut (ACOG) and the Planning Commission continue to review and revise at its monthly meetings. Approximately 20% complete. The Commission also began discussions on regulations for chickens and short-term rentals.

Comprehensive Plan Update: Staff and Planning Commission continue to review and update, alongside Zoning update. Approximately 27% complete. Staff preparing additional updates that will be presented at the January meeting.

Municipal Volunteer Program (MVP): Thirteen (13) individuals have signed up to date. Initial MVP groups volunteering with staff on grounds maintenance, including weeding, planting, bed preparation, decorating, Christmas events, etc.

FEMA Hurricane Helene Projects: Continue to partner through now monthly meetings with FEMA and SCEMD on reimbursement and Hurricane Helene related projects. Projects continue to move through the approval process, four have been obligated. Received reimbursement for \$116,704.45, with another \$36,920.37 currently being processed. Additional information has been requested by FEMA for the pedestrian bridge project; and it is being compiled for submittal.

Springbrook Conversion: Work continues for the Permit/License and Payroll modules. Total project approximately 75% complete.

Police Station: Finalized the design of the facility and civil engineering. Seeking building permits. Groundbreaking ceremony and site work planned for December 17.

Paving (C-Fund Appropriation): Reviewing two bids with the City of Seneca. Sought and received additional funding from C-Funds to aid in higher bid.

Community Center: Groundwork began 11/11. Mass grading on-going. Building delivered 12/5. Footers to be poured the week of 12/15.

Sertoma Concession Stand/Restrooms: Final build-out continues.

Stumphouse Mountain Park Pay Gates/Building: Installation of pay gates complete and now in operation. Revised trail maps are complete and will be posted onsite, on cycling apps and in paper form. Partnering with Visit Oconee on tear away maps for distribution.

SCIIP Division I Sewer Rehab Project: Contractor has completed the cleaning and inspection of the gravity sewers and the cure-in-place rehab process for most of the project. Approximately 22,000 linear feet of gravity sewer pipe have been lined. Project is approximately 96% complete.

To date, \$1,257,649.35 paid and reimbursed, total revised bid \$2,881,292.20

SCIIP Division II Water Line Upgrade Project: Contractor is installing new pump at Rocky Knoll and upgrading a section of water line along Highlands Highway. Installation is expected to begin the week of 12/15 with pipe delivery the week of 12/8. To date, \$22,709.09 paid and reimbursed, total revised bid \$2,551,038.94

SCIIP Division III Water Line Upgrade Project: Contractor is installing water services along S North Broad St, Main St, Poplar St and side streets. The water main replacement installation is approximately 98% complete. Water mains have been tested and certified. SCDES issued a Permit to Operate the new lines. The new water line along West Main Street from Pine Street South to Stoudemire Street was tied-in the second week of December. To date, \$1,815,865.22 paid and reimbursed, total revised bid \$4,016,187.94

SCIIP Division IV Water Line Upgrade Project: A RFQ was posted for the additionally approved work. Bid opening planned for December 18.

Emergency Watershed Program (EWP) Project: Reviewing RFQ submissions for engineering services with ACOG. Meetings with USDA representatives are expected to restart this month after the Federal Shutdown ended.
