UTILITIES COMMITTEE MEETING JANUARY 2023

- The Department has purchased an additional data collector for the Kamstrup Meter system. The new collector will save time and energy by gathering meter reads from the Kamstrup Meters, and provide hourly data, in most cases, for meters within its range. The collector will improve meter reading accuracy, and customer service. As additional meters are installed, this will allow for automated reads. We plan to install the collector in a location that provides long-range reception, once it is delivered.
- The holiday weekend, 12-23 to 12-26 was a very busy time for the Department. The cold temperatures caused multiple issues, including frozen meters, frozen customer lines, frozen plumbing, and numerous leaks. There were over 60 calls from Friday afternoon until Sunday evening. There were many more structures that had water flowing from their doors, including churches, homes, and businesses, that were not called in, but were observed by staff, and turned off. Multiple main line breaks were repaired on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- On Christmas Day, we began receiving calls of no water at approximately 8:45 AM. A call to the water plant and review of the tank level history chart revealed that there was a loss of system pressure at approximately 8:20 AM. The plant was able to increase production and restore service by approximately 9:45 AM. Hours of searching the system for leaks revealed nothing. A check of the measurement instruments revealed a faulty level indicator, leading to the false assumption of having a full tank. Moving forward, redundant systems will be installed to prevent future events of this type from occurring.

Incident Response-

We responded to 134 calls for service. 59 were fire calls and 75 were medical/rescue calls. During the month we were on multiple calls 19% of the time. We provided 27 instances of mutual aid. 48 calls were inside the City and 86 calls were either in the unincorporated area or another district. Average on scene time was 23 minutes. Both career and volunteer staff spent 160 hours on incidents.


